seeks to strengthen a sense of belonging for up to 300 adults with additional needs within a safe environment, thus providing their caregivers with peace of mind.

The AWWA Day Activity Centre

is a community-based facility that aims to maximise the independence of up to 50 adults with physical and multiple disabilities to continue being active members of the community, and to provide respite to caregivers.

Holistic Care

- We help clients maximise choice and control in alignment with their preferences.
- We provide graded assistance – every client receives just the right amount of support when they are ready.
- We believe that every moment has potential to be better.
- We leverage on a multi-professional team of care specialists, coaches, psychologists, therapists, and nurses to create holistic care plans to meet the unique needs of each client.



Our Technology-Enabled Facilities

- A gamified therapy system
- Infrared motion sensors
- An immersive room
- Electronic tablets-on-wheels with the use of robots
- A well-equipped kitchen area for baking and cooking activities



Examples of Activities

- Training on Independent and Community Living Skills
- Therapeutic-based games and activities to maintain the functional status of each client based on their needs and preferences
- Training on personal grooming such as personal hygiene, oral care, body care and dressing
- Mobility training through proper navigation and use of mobility aids within the compound and in the community



Eligibility Criteria

Applicants should be:

- Aged 18 and above[^]
- Singapore Citizens or Permanent Residents¹
- Diagnosed with disabilities of the following nature[#]:
 - Physical
 - Intellectual
 - Sensory (e.g. Low vision)

[^]Persons with disabilities who are below 21 would need the consent of parents or legal guardians for their application.

¹ For Permanent Residents, at least one immediate family member must be a Singapore Citizen. Immediate family member refers to spouses, parents, children of the applicant, including step-parents and step-children.

[#]All applicants must be diagnosed with a physical disability. We are unable to serve persons diagnosed with autism.

As our facilities support communal living, applicants will not be eligible if:

- They have untreated infectious disease(s).
- They are suffering from serious psychotic disorders and/or serious behaviours of concern that require them to be under close individual supervision or nursing care.

All applications must be submitted through SG Enable, and all applicants will be required to go through means-testing.
